

COMICS/GRAPHIC NOVEL MAKING


After retiring in 2015, at a rather young age, he thought about his lifelong passion: Making comics. Growing up in a French colony in South East Asia, he was exposed to all the genres of comics, from American superheroes, to French Bandes Dessinee, and Japanese Manga. Since childhood his dream has always been to create and publish his own comics. By 2023, he has published 5 full graphic novels on-sale worldwide, translated into 6 languages. This presentation will include:

- the history of comics
- How we view comics and comics for today's audience
- variety of comics all over the world and
- touch on the process of making a comic.

There will be no categories this month.



From Field to Frame: The PAC6 Shows How It's Done

The journey of every finished painting, and every artist, is different. From inspiration and field notes, to finished work and framing, this show will feature a peek behind the curtain of the creative processes used by the PAC6 painters to create artwork inspired by their travels together.

The group, called the PAC6 (Six Women Painting Across the Country) has enjoyed road trips to fabulous spots to paint such as Canyon de Chelly, a pack-trip to Ediza Lake in the Western Sierra Nevada, Lake Tahoe, Carson, Nevada, Virginia City, Mammoth Lakes, the Bishop Area, Carmel and Monterey, the Vermillion Cliffs, Monument Valley, and the Grand Canyon.
