How are you at drawing the human figure? According to our guest artist for February it is the best of all worlds for an artist, the most beautiful art form on this earth. We just need more encouragement to do figure drawing for the sheer joy of it.

Marciano Martinez, Professor of Art at Fullerton College, is just the one to inspire you. Marciano, a native of Claremont, CA, has lived for the Fine Arts all his life. His teachers at Claremont High were his first mentors, especially Joe Montiani. With George Post his mentor at the California College of Arts and Crafts in Oakland, CA, Marciano received his Bachelor of Educational Arts. Later Millard Sheets was instrumental in getting Marciano a scholarship to The Los Angeles County Institute of Art. He studied with Milford Zornes since his high school days. Robert E. Wood was also been a great influence on him.

With such a dynamic teacher before us - how could we sit still and watch? Well, we won't! This meeting will be set up as a class; you can sit and sketch or bring your easel. Work large or small. There will be live models.

If you haven't tried drawing the figure this will be a wonderful opportunity to get your feet wet, this is "not my thing" either, but by golly, I want to try. With Marciano as the teacher you will truly inspired to give it a try. Please no paint; pencil, pastels, charcoal, pen and ink are ok. If you need a small table, bring your own.

ERNIE MARJORAM OIL PAINTING WORKSHOP APRIL 16-18

Growing up in the suburbs of Los Angeles during the 1970's Ernie was influenced by surf culture, hot rods and Disneyland. These varied interests led him to study architecture at Cal Poly Pomona where he excelled in perspective drawing and architectural history classes. While spending his senior year in Florence, Italy Ernie fell in love with Italian art, architecture and Silvia, who is now his wife. After graduation in 1976, Ernie worked as an architect and continued to travel throughout Europe, Egypt and Asia. In 1993 he established a consulting business to design and illustrate projects for architects, interior designers and entertainment clients. Encouraged by the client-artists at Walt Disney Imagineering to exhibit his travel sketches, Ernie launched his career as an exhibiting artist with a solo show "Europe, Asia and the US" in 2005.

Ernie's favorite subjects are exotic architectural landmarks painted in a representational yet impressionist style. Recently Ernie had his second solo show "Bell' Italia". Also during 2008 his work was exhibited at the Pasadena Museum of California Art, the Huntington Library, Bergamot Station and TAG Gallery in Santa Monica. His has presented numerous demonstrations for local art clubs including the San Gabriel Fine Arts Association, East Valley Art Association, Burbank Art Association and served as the juror for the Anaheim Art Association open competition. Ernie has been teaching public art classes for the last four years and is a Senior Lecturer in Production Design at the American Film Institute. About The Workshop - "Art FUNdamentals"

Each day of this fun filled three day workshop will cover one of the major issues in art; drawing skills, lighting design and color control. Props will be supplied by the instructor or you may bring your own. Day one will focus on form metaphors, measuring proportions and using perspective to create a solid drawing as a foundation for your art. Day two will explore how to use lighting to sculpt form, create atmosphere and direct the viewer's attention where you want it. The last day of instruction will cover how to use a minimal palette of primary pigments to mix color hues to create harmony, color saturations to create depth and color temperatures to create volume. Regardless of subject choose or medium you use, a deeper understanding of these essential concepts will improve your art.





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




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
