
JOANN FORMIA

to that next level by learning a process that will take the guesswork out of your next painting and give you the confidence that watercolor demands. Taking advantage of a lo-tek masking technique you'll be able to loosen your paintings and become a

more expressive artist.

Joe Cibere is signature member of the National Watercolor Society and his painting style demonstrates his love of nature and wilderness. His "abstract realism"



paintings integrate strong design and balance with a sense of illusion. He has appeared in "Watercolor Magazine" and in the International Artists book "The Watercolor Sky and Cloud Techniques of 23 International Artists". He is also in the new book "Splash 20" and the 2019 February issue of "Watercolor Artist" magazine. His studio is at Studio Channel Islands, Room R5 in Old Town Camarillo, CA.

JoAnn Formia Online Workshop

Creative Abstract Painting in Watercolor April 23 & April 30, 2021

JoAnn wants to share her love with watercolor and abstract painting with you by revealing her skill in both areas. An alternate way of creating a successful abstract painting will be presented, using a limited pallet, a combination of soft and hard edges, line work (calligraphy) if needed.

On the first day, we will prepare two paintings for use on the second Friday. The two paintings are shown here. Spend time to complete both pieces as necessary.

JoAnn hopes that this workshop will help newcomers to watercolor painting realizing it is not necessary to work so hard. In many cases if you let it and be relaxed, watercolor will tell you what to do. A big brush helps and allows more freedom in applying the pigment. Also, she finds she is more successful in painting while she is standing up, you can put your whole shoulder into the process instead of just your arm and wrist. This applies to large pieces.

She hopes that this time together will encourage more watercolorists to surface and find self-satisfaction in this medium for use throughout the year creating art for themselves and others. Another reward of this wonderful medium is to be able to create and send original note cards to friends and relatives. During this time of isolation, it is a good way to put your extra time to good use. It is not always about competition but self-satisfaction.

Keiko Tanabe 3-Day Online Watercolor Workshop

June 1, 3, and 5, 2021
"Keeping It Simple and Strong"

ABOUT THE ARTIST/INSTRUCTOR: Keiko Tanabe AWS, NWS



Often working en plein air, Keiko's atmospheric watercolor captures perfectly a sense of time and place. Through her use of color, texture, and signature brushwork, Keiko's landscapes and cityscapes beautifully convey the exotic and the simple scenes of the many places she travels. Never having attended art school, Keiko took one drawing class to learn basic technical skills before she started painting in 2005. One year later, after learning basic drawing and watercolor painting skills at a local community school in San Diego, she decided to paint full-time.

From then on, Keiko intensely taught herself to be fluent in watercolor painting, just as one would do to master a foreign language. Keiko's subjects include landscape, cityscape, waterscape, and interior scenes, which she will be demonstrating in this workshop.

Since 2011, Keiko has successfully conducted more than 300 workshops and numerous live demonstrations around the world.









ABOUT THE KEIKO TANABE WORKSHOP:

This workshop is designed for those who would like to gain a better understanding of methods and techniques to make a watercolor painting that is simple yet strong. The goal is to capture the essence of the subject that conveys a certain mood and atmosphere. The process of simplifying begins with visualization. In representational art, this ability to see the end result of a painting, through the mind's eye, is instrumental in realizing an artist's vision.

Through sketches and step-by-step

demonstrations, Keiko will show you how to take the initial inspiration, through the simplification process, to an expressive painting that is strong in composition and content. There will be an active question-and-answer session and critique on a daily basis. Subject matter includes landscape, cityscape, waterscape, and interior scenes. They will be demonstrated in a manner that is more representational and impressionistic rather than abstract.

The topics to be covered in this workshop are: preliminary drawing and composition; techniques in paint application and brush handling; dark vs light; determining what makes a good design (color, shape, value, edges); planning and intuition; and editing complex visual information.

The materials list and reference photos will be provided prior to the workshop.

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
