

DALE LAITINEN

Most MVAL members are familiar with Dale's work, we enjoyed his participation in 'Saturday in the Park with the Masters" last year, but it has been a while since Dale has demonstrated for our General Meeting. We will be meeting in the larger room this month - so plenty of room - bring all your artist's friends for this great demo.

"I tell my students I never make mistakes, just adjustments. I use what is happening on the paper and I adjust accordingly."

"In California and the West the environment itself is a species of sculpture, and earth work. The landscape reveals the patterns under the earth. It makes for a different aesthetic than you'd find in the East, where green grass covers the contours of the land." Dale Laitinen is best known for his aqua media landscape painting of the west. he lives and works in the rural California uplands of the Sierras where he is drawn to the topography of exposed rock which mani-



fests itself as light catching ranges of mountains and deep canyons. The hall mark of a Laitinen painting is a unique blend of representation and abstraction that reveals clarity of form and shape.

Born in Minnesota, but a resident of California most of his life. A graduate in fine arts from San Jose State University, Laitinen spent eight years as a long haul trucker on the highways of the American West before turning to painting full time. He is a signature member of the National Watercolor Society and Watercolor West. Laitinen's articles and paintings have been published in The Artist's Magazine, Watercolor Magic, The Splash series and several other books.

He has exhibited widely, including the National Watercolor Society, Watercolor USA, Watercolor West, and several solo and group shows. Gallery representation includes: Pogan Gallery, Tahoe City, CA; Dunn Mehler Gallery, Half Moon Bay, CA; Fine Eye Gallery, Sutter Creek, CA; and Pinecrest Gallery, Pinecrest, CA.

If you are unfamiliar with Dale's work you are in for a treat! He is a bold painter of landscapes but has often added strong structural elements to bring a greater sense of drama and disjunction to his paintings.

There is still room in the workshop being taught by Dale the same week - see the form on page 9.

The award will be for \$100 for the painting which best exemplifies the Zornes precepts.

Write a check for \$25 to MVAL and write the name(s) of the honoree(s) on the memo line at the bottom left. Recipients will receive a \$25 check and a "Special Award" ribbon.

In the event that more than one donor wishes to honor an individual/group, the show co-chair will contact the donor whose check is received after the first one has been recorded in the awards log to determine if 1) they wish to identify a different person or 2) they wish to withdraw the award.

The awards will be placed on the paintings as an extension of the current award list and the name card on the wall will identify the honoree and the donor unless the donor specifies that they wish to remain anonymous.


