AN ORGANIZING APPROACH TO PAINTING IN WATERCOLOR"

Have you ever approached a clean white piece of watercolor paper, wondering "Where should I begin?" After years of classes and workshops, Julie realized that she needed a way to synthesize the information her instructors had so generously imparted so that her brain wasn't bombarding her with all of the disparate bits as she painted. In this one-day workshop, Julie Crouch will share how she simplifies her thought process in order to paint stronger watercolors by planning of value and shape through layering. Working with large and small shapes with hard and soft edges. Ultimately recognizing when to stop.
