APRIL DEMONSTRATION

DAVID DEYELL

David is a landscape painter. He will discuss how all media artists can create art using values, shapes and color. Using what is seen and then interpreted, David teaches creation rather than duplication. Discussion will include "reason for each painting" "large shape" and "simultaneous color."

Background: N.Y. Technical High School, Pratt University, licensed California Architect, AIA Emeritus, Author of "Art of Plein Air Watercolor" published book, annual Yosemite Resident Artist (20 years), weekly local art classes in City of Agoura Hills, weekly local art classes in Oak Park (15 years)-on hold due to pandemic, demonstrator, art competition juror and winner of several Best of Shows. David's paintings of Yosemite have been purchased by Yosemite visitors from all over the world.

Instructors: He has learned art from Edgar Whitney, Tony Couch, Milford Zornes, Henry Fukuhara, Tom Fong, Chris Van Winkle, as well as his students and fellow artists.

David will TALK and PAINT at the same time, demonstrating a designed landscape scene. Time permitting he will do a second painting using the "wet into wet" technique.

He will be painting Yosemite for his watercolor demonstration on Wednesday April 20.

ARTIST'S NEWS



Linda Kemp Online Watercolor Workshop

May 31, June 1, & June 3,2022

'Negative Painting Obsession' - Blossoms and Foliage

Discover how to start, build, and complete watercolor florals as you learn the essential skills of negative painting.

In this 3-day workshop, you will discover how to paint delicate blossoms and foliage. All it takes is a simple shift in the way you see! Linda will demonstrate and lead you step-by-step through the key exercises and tactics of working with this unconventional, inspiring approach.

Topics covered in this program include: interpreting your subject, negative painting strategies, simplified design, basic color concepts, and "seeing" for painting. You will learn how to reduce florals into simplified shapes, create purposeful underpaintings, and practice the glazing techniques used for layering negative shapes.

On the first day, we develop control by working on dry paper, in readiness for the thrill of building wetinto-wet layers on the second and third days. This is watercolour showing off!

Our time together will include video demonstration, hands-on painting time, and live discussion about how to apply negative painting

concepts to your favorite subjects and options for creative painting rescue. Once you learn the basics, you will see and paint the world in an exciting and different way.

This workshop is suitable for all levels, although some painting experience is recommended.

Think positive about negative painting!

Janet Rogers Online Watercolor Workshop

July 5, July 7 & July 9,2022

Expressive Watercolors - Flowers, Faces & Figures

We will begin this online workshop with our study of the nature of flowers - learning to interpret flowers in a loose and spontaneous manner - concentrating on discovering the power and movement of color, designing with individual flowers as well as groupings, values, edges (soft vs. hard), leaving white paper as part of the design, and controlling water and brush strokes to provide an intuitive experience.

This part of the workshop will involve sending you some photos of flowers (mostly individual ones, a variety), which you can use for your paintings or use your favorites photos or live flowers - (usually Janet loves to paint live flowers but she realizes it is hard to share). You can use Janet's photos for your learning process.

We will then move into learning to interpret the head and figure – which consists of a series of lessons, quick exercises and then into painting – thus enabling students to gain knowledge and confidence in an approach. In painting, we will focus on discovering the unique qualities of translucent flesh tones, features, hair, background, clothing, etc. - and in the figure - the fun of discovering the gesture - which is pervasive throughout the workshop.

You will receive at least 2 images of what Janet will paint for example: a young lady with dark hair, and a child with blonde hair. These will be for your use to draw ahead of the workshop to paint what Janet will paint - OR USE YOUR OWN PHOTOS AND READY THEM FOR THE PAINTING PROCESS - You even may want to try both.
