

#### **KEIKO TANABE**

Keiko was born in Kyoto, Japan. As a child growing up in an art-loving family, she always enjoyed drawing and painting and won many awards in children's art contests. However, art was not her chosen field of study later on. She earned a B.A. in intercultural communication (International Christian University, Tokyo, Japan) and an M.A. in international education (UCLA, California). She then worked in international relations positions in a Japanese government trade organization in Tokyo, at a large law firm in San Francisco and at a private consulting firm in San Diego. For decades, she has traveled extensively, mainly in European countries, Asia and North America.

Through all these years, Keiko knew there was in her heart the growing desire to someday become an artist. Mostly self-taught, Keiko embarked on a professional art career in 2005 and started exhibiting publicly. In the same year she took a workshop from Alvaro Castagnet and discovered the joy of plein-air painting. Since that year her paintings have been juried into many exhibitions across Americas and in Asia and Europe.

#### WE ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO KEIKO TANABE'S WORK-SHOP, JUNE 1, 3, AND 5.

#### "KEEPING IT SIMPLE AND STRONG"

Through sketches and step-by-step demonstrations (e.g., landscape, cityscape, waterscape, and interior scenes), Keiko will show us how to simplify the subject by capturing its essence and conveying a certain mood and atmosphere.

June 1: The emphasis will be on tonal values and core techniques. Keiko's first and second demos, while of different subjects, will explain how to see and understand values and how they work effectively in a painting.

June 3: To share her tips to better composition, Keiko will

**June 3**: To share her tips to better composition, Keiko will demonstrate 1-2 paintings, and she will give us a chance to practice.

**June 5**: Putting it all together—Keiko will talk about how we can orchestrate the elements and concepts that make a better design in a painting. She will review fundamental principles in her demonstration. During the workshop, we will paint and apply the principles that we have learned. There will be an active question-and-answer and critique period daily.

- \* An overview of fine art sales sites, options for selling art prints or prints ---- and many more....


#### **IN MEMORIAM**

**Entry Dates** (online or postmark): May 1 - June 30, 2021 **Awards Presentation:** September 15, 2021

**Exhibit Dates:** September 16 – October 31, 2021

**ELIGIBILITY/RULES:** MVAL members only. One entry per member. Original artwork not over three years old. Not being shown in another physical or digital show during exhibit dates. Photo image of artwork suitable for online viewing and true representation of original artwork. No copyrighted internet or published visual source material. Any 2-dimensional media, excluding fabric, photographic, computer-generated, and computer-altered original.

**Digital photo** of artwork suitable for online viewing and true representation of original artwork.

Photograph artwork without mat or frame. Straighten, crop, and/or re-size photo as required for: square corners, file size of no more than 2000 pixels on longest side and no more than 10MG. Save in .jpg or .png format with artist's first initial, last name, and image title as file name (eg, J.Doe Desert Waterfall). Help for resizing photo is available on the MVAL website at www.midvalleyartsleague.org/virtual-art-of-the-month.html.

#### **REGISTRATION:** May 1 through June 30, 2021

No changes may be made after submission. No entry will be accepted after deadline.

Photo image of original artwork must then be sent by email as attachment with TITLE and ARTIST NAME (both exactly as submitted on Registration Form) to MVALMembersExhibit@gmail.com.

**SALES:** "Sale Inquiry" link will be available in Exhibit Gallery which will go to sales information with active link to a MVAL email address. Buyer email will be forwarded to artist. Artist is responsible for making all sales and delivery arrangements with buyer

**HONOR COURT CRITERIA:** Entries submitted by members of the Honor Court will be juried separately and awarded prizes separately. Membership in the Honor Court is determined by the Selection Committee using criteria including: publication of the artist's work, best of show winners, signature membership in other art organizations, service as a juror in art exhibitions, workshop demonstrators and teaching experience. There are no entry categories for Honor Court entries.

#### **CATEGORIES:**

Artist will indicate desired category on Registration Form. MVAL may change category with artist's approval if deemed more appropriate. MVAL may combine categories for judging based on number or distribution of entries.

The categories for General Membership are as follows:

**Non-Objective:** Artwork which relies on one or more of the Elements of Art (line, shape, form, color, space, texture, value) to achieve effect, and in which figures, objects or scenes from the natural world are not recognizable or are minimal and incidental to the image.

**Abstracted Realism:** Artwork which relies on one or more of the Elements of Art (line, shape, form, color, space, texture, value) to achieve effect. Image shows a significant departure from realistic depiction of scenes, living things, or inanimate objects, but subject is still recognizable.

**Landscape:** Artwork in which an outdoor nature scene is dominant, but may include minimal or incidental structures, people, or objects. Work may be rendered in a photographic, painterly, or impressionistic manner but does not significantly depart from what may be seen in nature.

**Seascape:** Artwork in which the sea or ocean is dominant, but may include minimal or incidental structures, boats, landscape, people, or animals.

**Cityscape/Structural/Mechanical:** Artwork that depicts a scene showing buildings, equipment, machinery, or has a structural or architectural emphasis, but may include incidental figures, animals, or objects.

**Floral/Still Life/Object:** Artwork featuring in relative close-up one or a group of natural objects such as flowers, pebbles, hands, wing; and/or man-made objects such as pottery, sculpture, car ornament.

**Animal:** Artwork in which the main subject is one or more animals.

**Portrait/Figure:** Artwork in which the main subject is one or a group of human figures or heads. These often, but not always, are an artistic representation of a particular person or group in which the face is predominant with intent to express the likeness, personality and perhaps mood or attitude of the main subject.

**Genre:** Artwork primarily meant to depict an action or activity in scenes from everyday life, rather than those performing it.

# Keiko Tanabe 3-Day Online Watercolor Workshop

June 1, 3, and 5, 2021
"Keeping It Simple and Strong"

ABOUT THE ARTIST/INSTRUCTOR: Keiko Tanabe AWS, NWS



Often working en plein air, Keiko's atmospheric watercolor captures perfectly a sense of time and place. Through her use of color, texture, and signature brushwork, Keiko's landscapes and cityscapes beautifully convey the exotic and the simple scenes of the many places she travels. Never having attended art school, Keiko took one drawing class to learn basic technical skills before she started painting in 2005. One year later, after learning basic drawing and watercolor painting skills at a local community school in San Diego, she decided to paint full-time.

From then on, Keiko intensely taught herself to be fluent in watercolor painting, just as one would do to master a foreign language. Keiko's subjects include landscape, cityscape, waterscape, and interior scenes, which she will be demonstrating in this workshop.

Since 2011, Keiko has successfully conducted more than 300 workshops and numerous live demonstrations around the world.









#### ABOUT THE KEIKO TANABE WORKSHOP:

This workshop is designed for those who would like to gain a better understanding of methods and techniques to make a watercolor painting that is simple yet strong. The goal is to capture the essence of the subject that conveys a certain mood and atmosphere. The process of simplifying begins with visualization. In representational art, this ability to see the end result of a painting, through the mind's eye, is instrumental in realizing an artist's vision.

Through sketches and step-by-step

demonstrations, Keiko will show you how to take the initial inspiration, through the simplification process, to an expressive painting that is strong in composition and content. There will be an active question-and-answer session and critique on a daily basis. Subject matter includes landscape, cityscape, waterscape, and interior scenes. They will be demonstrated in a manner that is more representational and impressionistic rather than abstract.

The topics to be covered in this workshop are: preliminary drawing and composition; techniques in paint application and brush handling; dark vs light; determining what makes a good design (color, shape, value, edges); planning and intuition; and editing complex visual information.

The materials list and reference photos will be provided prior to the workshop.
