

Go south to Foothill, make left on Foothill, go past Indian Hill St. 1 block to College St. (small street on your left, easy to miss.) will be long narrow road to parking lot. Arrange to meet there for lunch, no food allowed in garden. Entrance fee.

July 11-13th - Laguna Beach Wednesday-Friday (Alternate, L.A. Arboretum)

(Wednesday you are on your own, but I will be in Laguna Canyon) Thursday: Montage Resort. Take Pacific Coast Highway south to Wesley Dr. turn right to underground parking. metered parking, open to the public. Fantastic views of the Keyhole Rock. Access to the beach. Bring a cart, it's a walk!

Valley Center Ave. turn right and continue north to Sierra Madre Ave. bare left then make right on Glendora Mountain Rd. turn Right onto Big Dalton Canyon Rd. Look for campground sign. Campground is for overnight campers only. Park on Big Dalton Canyon Rd.

Admission: \$12-adult \$9 senior (62+) Lots of animals to draw that won't move! (No critique, so stay as long as you like!) Bring a lunch or eat at nearby restaurants.

Exit fwy at Orange Grove Blvd. Go south on Orange Grove to W. California Blvd, turn right. Arroyo Blvd, turn right. Lower Arroyo Park entrance is on the left. Good view of the Colorado St. Bridge and casting pond. Lots of parking and restrooms. Bring lunch.

Take the 110 fwy south to San Pedro. Keep left at the fork, follow signs for San Pedro. Turn left onto N. Gaffey St. Turn right onto W. Paseo Del Mar. Lighthouse will be on your left. Bring a lunch.
