

ELIGIBILITY/REQUIREMENTS: MVAL members only. One entry per member.

Original artwork should not be over three years old and should not have been shown in another physical or digital location during exhibit dates. Artists may not use copyrighted internet or published visual source material. Any 2-dimensional media, excluding fabric, photographic, computer-generated, and computer-altered original is acceptable.

Digital photo of artwork suitable for online viewing and true representation of original artwork. Photograph artwork without mat or frame. Straighten, crop, and/or re-size photo as required for: square corners, file size of no more than 2000 pixels on longest side and no more than 10MG. Save in .jpg or .png format with artist's first initial, last name, and image title as file name (e.g. J.Doe Desert Waterfall). Help for resizing photo is available on the MVAL website at www.midvalleyartsleague.org/virtual-art-of-the-month.html.

REGISTRATION/ENTRY: July 1 through July 30, 2022

No changes may be made after submission. No entry will be accepted after deadline.

If you cannot register online, you may print registration form, fill in all fields, and mail with check to MVAL Members Exhibit, c/o J.Windoffer, 1137 North Cedar Street, Glendale CA 91207. Photo image of original artwork must then be sent by email as attachment with TITLE and ARTIST NAME (both exactly as submitted on Registration Form) to MVALMembersExhibit@gmail.com.

SALES: "Sale Inquiry" link will be available in Exhibit Gallery which will go to sales information with active link to a MVAL email address. Buyer email will be forwarded to artist. Artist is responsible for making all sales and delivery arrangements with buyer.

HONOR COURT CRITERIA: Entries submitted by members of the Honor Court will be juried separately and awarded prizes separately. Membership in the Honor Court is determined by the Selection Committee using criteria including: publication of the artist's work, best of show winners, signature membership in other art organizations, service as a juror in art exhibitions, workshop demonstrators and teaching experience. There are no entry categories for Honor Court entries.

CATEGORIES: Artist will indicate desired category on Registration Form. MVAL may change category with artist's approval if deemed more appropriate. MVAL may combine categories for judging based on number and/or distribution of entries

Categories for General Membership

Non-Objective: Artwork which relies on one or more of the Elements of Art (line, shape, form, color, space, texture, value) to achieve effect, and in which figures, objects or scenes from the natural world are not recognizable or are minimal and incidental to the image.

Abstracted Realism: Artwork which relies on one or more of the Elements of Art (line, shape, form, color, space, texture, value) to achieve effect. Image shows a significant departure from realistic depiction of scenes, living things, or inanimate objects, but subject is still recognizable.

Landscape: Artwork in which an outdoor nature scene is dominant, but may include minimal or incidental structures, people, or objects. Work may be rendered in a photographic, painterly, or impressionistic manner but does not significantly depart from what may be seen in nature.

Exhibit Prospectus continued

Seascape: Artwork in which the sea or ocean is dominant, but may include minimal or incidental structures, boats, landscape, people, or animals.

Cityscape/Structural/Mechanical: Artwork that depicts a scene showing buildings, equipment, machinery, or has a structural or architectural emphasis, but may include incidental figures, animals, or objects.

Floral/Still Life/Object: Artwork featuring in relative close-up one or a group of natural objects such as flowers, pebbles, hands, wing; and/or man-made objects such as pottery, sculpture, car ornament.

Animal: Artwork in which the main subject is one or more animals.

Portrait/Figure: Artwork in which the main subject is one or a group of human figures or heads. These often, but not always, are an artistic representation of a particular person or group in which the face is predominant with intent to express the likeness, personality and perhaps mood or attitude of the main subject.

Genre: Artwork primarily meant to depict an action or activity in scenes from everyday life, rather than those performing it.

Janet Rogers Online Watercolor Workshop

July 5, July 7 & July 9,2022

Expressive Watercolors - Flowers, Faces & Figures

We will begin this online workshop with our study of the nature of flowers - learning to interpret flowers in a loose and spontaneous manner - concentrating on discovering the power and movement of color, designing with individual flowers as well as groupings, values, edges (soft vs. hard), leaving white paper as part of the design, and controlling water and brush strokes to provide an intuitive experience.

This part of the workshop will involve sending you some photos of flowers (mostly individual ones, a variety), which you can use for your paintings or use your favorites photos or live flowers - (usually Janet loves to paint live flowers but she realizes it is hard to share). You can use Janet's photos for your learning process.

We will then move into learning to interpret the head and figure - which consists of a series of lessons, quick exercises and then into painting - thus enabling students to gain knowledge and confidence in an approach. In painting, we will focus on discovering the unique qualities of translucent flesh tones, features, hair, background, clothing, etc. - and in the figure - the fun of discovering the gesture - which is pervasive throughout the workshop.

You will receive at least 2 images of what Janet will paint for example: a young lady with dark hair, and a child with blonde hair. These will be for your use to draw ahead of the workshop to paint what Janet will paint - OR USE YOUR OWN PHOTOS AND READY THEM FOR THE PAINTING PROCESS - You even may want to try both.

George Politis Online Watercolor Workshop

September 23, 24, & 25,2022

Internationally renowned artist, George Politis will teach watercolor and watermedia in this 3-day workshop. You will learn to see and find a subject (often far from the obvious). Through George's thinking process and technique, this workshop aims to boost creativity by finding inspirational ideas. Various subjects might include:

- Painting the dream island of Santorini/Oia
- Painting portrait to convey emotions and thoughts
- Creating a poster in large format with stenciled image
- Using textures, and different media

Artist Statement

I love painting in watercolor and mixed watermedia.

Selecting whether going in the "pure" direction of totally transparent watercolour, or using acrylic inks, collage and other media is based on the subject and on the personal reaction to a potential subject.

The medium is not the most important thing. The result is.
Thus, I like to experiment a lot and find new ways to express
my ideas. I experiment with various materials and processes,
very often disregarding rules. Especially in my "Wall Series", I
like to create some controlled chaos and find ways to
compose and create a balanced painting out of this chaos.

I like aged material, rusty metal, weathered wood...

Time plays a very basic role in my paintings; particularly the way it leaves its mark on varied objects and on nature itself fascinates me. I see in the old, rusty and ravaged both truth and excitement. I can find inspiration in ordinary and commonly overlooked items, responding to them with dramatically different feelings each time, whether emphasizing the serenity, the loneliness, the atmosphere, the melancholy.

My aim is to make the viewer share my feelings and share my love for such objects that have "lived" in glory once... and that can still have sparkle today!!
