

SEPTEMBER PROGRAM

BILL HUDSON

Bill Hudson was born in 1944 in Baltimore, Maryland. He comes from a family of watermen who worked on the Chincoteague Bay from the small fishing village of Greenbackville on the Eastern Shore of Virginia. His inherited love of the sea is evident in his watercolors.

Having an aptitude for science and mathematics as well as art, Bill graduated with a BS in Mechanical Engineering from *Drexel University* in Philadelphia. He then pursued a 38-year career in aerospace. His proudest moments came, however, when he married his wife Ellie and they subsequently became blessed with eight children and 17 grandchildren (by 2017 count).

Retired from engineering with the children grown, Bill is now enjoying his second career as a watercolor maritime artist. "For me, there has always been a strong attraction to commercial fishing which I discovered as a young boy during summers with my grandparents and the watermen of Greenbackville, Virginia. The buildings, wharfs, crab pots, oyster tongs, old wooden work boats, salt water, and open skies were a world different from the city pavements of Baltimore. Watermen have a simpler appreciation of life that I line up with. As an artist, maritime scenes still grab me and inherently provide the elements necessary for a good painting. Water adds contrast in edges, shapes, and value. And reflections guarantee compositional continuity."


Bill has exhibited in numerous venues and galleries along the west coast including Laguna Beach, Malibu, Beverly Hills, Carmel, La Jolla, La Quinta, and Indian Wells. In addition to exhibiting, Bill has been a juror for many events including the *Festival of Arts* in Laguna Beach. Bill is frequently invited to art leagues and watercolor societies where he demonstrates his painting techniques. He authored and published the *Watercolor Pocket Guide* which concisely illustrates 44 useful painting techniques. Bill is also the inventor and patent holder of the Mahl Bridge and Mahl Bridge Clamps. - tools that were introduced to the art

community in 2006. Both are now available world-wide. See "MahlBridge.com"



From Live Oak and Peck Road in Arcadia, go South on Peck Rd to Clark Street, continue almost one block, look for small sign on your right, just a dirt like drive way into park.(easy to miss) Water in the lake with good reflections and mountain view. Rest rooms and picnic tables, bring lunch.

SEP 14th - DESCANSO GARDENS, LA CANADA

Take 210 Fwy to Angeles Crest exit in La Canada, turn left at end of ramp to Foothill Blvd, Turn right to Verdugo Blvd, Turn left to Descanso Drive, proceed to garden entrance on your right. There is an entrance fee. We will meet at the patio for lunch.

SEP 21st - EATON CANYON, ALTADENA

750 Altadena Drive. Take 210 FWY to Altadena exit. Go north on Altadena Dr. Cross New York Dr. look for sign and entrance on your right. Go down hill and park. Bring lunch.

SEP 28th - HAHAMUNGA PARK

Vibrant Paintings with Soon Y. Warren October 19-21, 2017

Watercolor Group Studio Exercise

The class will learn how to create an image of chosen subjects, such as, a cut crystal bowl with florals, Koi pond water, or Silver pots in watercolor with a step by step process. To speed up the class exercise, Soon Y. Warren will provide a reference photo and drawing for the group exercise. Following a painting demonstration, workshop participants will do their own painting in order to fully understand the process. While concentrating on technique, the concept of color theory, composition, and color values will be incorporated into the workshop.

The painting workshop participants will learn:

- Glazing and washing techniques to create a luminous under painting
- How to utilize light and dark values in order to capture the sparkle of glass
- How to approach a painting
- How to incorporate the concept of color theory and color relationships into a painting
- Discussion and critiques will follow during workshop session
- In addition to the group exercise, participants are encouraged to bring current pieces to paint along with reference photos. To make the most of instructional time, prepare the drawing before the workshop.
