

MARGARET DANIELAK

Pasadena-based Danielak Fine Art (www.danielakfineart. com) is an innovative art sales and consulting services company which specializes in producing art-related events in alternative venues. Founded in 2000 as DanielakArt, the company is owned by curator Margaret Danielak, the author of A Gallery without Walls: Selling Art in Alternative Venues (ArtNetwork Press).

Danielak Fine Art advises collectors and artists alike and conducts museum tours focusing on women made art. Clients include the California Art Club, the Southern California Women's Caucus for Art (SCWCA), La Galeria Gitana, the San Diego Fine Art Society, Avenue 50 Studio, Towns Burr Gallery, Silvana Gallery and the Monrovia Association of Fine Arts, among others.

Margaret Danielak holds a B.A. in History from the University of California at Berkeley and was a Producer Fellow at the American Film Institute. She is the author of A Gallery Without Walls, a guide to producing innovative artrelated events in alternative venues. The book was a featured selection of North Light Book Club.

An active volunteer in the Pasadena community, Ms. Danielak served on the Junior League of Pasadena's ART SMART Committee, in association with The Armory Center for the Arts, on art projects for disadvantaged youth.

Ms. Danielak has received numerous grants to conduct Feminist Museum Tours at California Museums including The Norton Simon Museum, The de Young Museum, and most recently, The Huntington Library - Virginia Steele Scott Galleries of American Art. An artist career coach, she also conducts The Art of Selling Art Workshops with award-winning artist, Julie Snyder, founder of Workshops in France, (www.workshopsinfrance.com).



FROM THE EDITOR

I joined MVAL in 1998 and became editor of Art and the Artist during my second year. I am fast approaching 20 years at this board position! There are 2 versions of the newsletter. We have about 40 a month that are still sent out by post. Most are people who do not have the email but about 10 are sent to schools, businesses and associations that have been supportive of MVAL in the past.

The email version is full of color! With the shift to email the newsletter has become much more image driven. IF you are able to get email and you have chosen to get the paper version instead, consider switching over. It's a better looking newsletter, better for the environment and the MVAL budget.

ANY member can put information in the newsletter, but it seems that there is a small group of repeat posters and a lot of members are not taking advantage of participation.

Deadline for submissions is the first Wednesday of the month. Exceptions for that "due" date are board members who may come up with new information or posts during the board meeting. Those submissions should be sent to me the following day, first Thursday of the month. If you have a show you are involved in that opens at the beginning of the month, send the information to be included in the newsletter the month before your show. Many submissions have had an Artist's Reception that is already over at the time of publishing.

We used to have a separate board position for gathering cover art for the newsletter. That position was eliminated when it became easy for people to email artwork. I end up with a relatively small group of repeat artists. I really would like MORE artists to participate. Send me your images if you would like to be on a cover.

Looking forward to a new MVAL year and more participation in the newsletter!

SEPT 5th & 12th - L.A. ARBORETUM

200 N. BALDWIN IN ARCADIA

210 Freeway to Baldwin Ave. off ramp head south to the entrance on your right. Plan on doing something monumental! We will be here for 2 Thursdays in a row. Eat lunch at the Peacock Cafe.

SEPT 19th - ECHO PARK, LOS ANGELES

Pasadena Freeway to the Hollywood Freeway take the Alvarado St. off ramp turn right and then right on Santa Ynez St. No parking on the Echo Park Ave. on Thursdays. Meet at the North end of the park.

SEPT 26th - ARLINGTON GARDENS

At the corner of Pasadena Ave. and Arlington Dr., 3 blocks south of Bellfontaine, and the Huntington Hospital. Bring lunch.

OCT 3rd - DEUKMEJIAN PARK, LA CRESCENTA

210 Freeway West to Pennsylvania Ave. Make a right and then a left at Foothill Blvd. At New York Ave. make a right and continue to the top. There will be a forced left at Markridge, continue 100 feet to park entrance on your right. Bring lunch.

OCT 10th - ROSE BOWL, PASADENA

Meet near the north end of the parking lot for Brookside Park, for good views of the Rose Bowl. Bring lunch

NOV 14th - RIALTO THEATER IN SOUTH PASADENA

Take Fair Oaks Ave. south past Mission to the Rialto Theatre on you right. parking available in the Von's shopping center south of the theatre. There are lots of places to grab some food, or bring your lunch.

NOV 21st OLVERA STREET, LOS ANGELES

Leave at 9:00 am on the Gold Line from the Sierra Madre Villa Station in Pasadena (Located at Halstead St. and Foothill) or drive and park in nearby lot.

In this workshop we will let loose and play! You will learn how to use Composition and Design to plan a strong painting. We will use line, shape, color, value and texture to make your paintings exciting. Step by step instructions will be given for a no fail abstract with lots of WOW FACTOR.

We will work wet into wet to use watercolor to its full potential. The addition of mixed media will allow you to create a painting that is unique to you. We will explore abstracting more realistic subjects as well as creating non-objective abstracts.
