This special time of year gives us an opportunity to reflect on all the gifts we have been blessed with.


As artists we have been given the gift of observation and the ability to translate what we observe into our own unique work of art.

BERNARD VIANNEY FALLON Pastels

Some of you may remember when we had Bernard Fallon demonstrate for us - it has been quite a few years...

We are pleased to have him return to re-inspire us to pull those pastels out of the drawer and explore this beautiful medium.

Bernard Fallon grew up in England and graduated from the Liverpool College of Art and Leicester University's School of Photography. a keen interest in the visual world has taken him to many places to create pictures - from the Aran Islands to the Sahara, Jerusalem to Singapore.

Fallon is a member of the California Art Club, and has demonstrated his painting to art organizations all over Southern California. He has taught many pastel and watercolor workshops, including UC Riverside Extension, and the Palos Verdes Art Center, California.

His work is held in collections here and abroad. In 1999-200 he contributed to "Strength from Unity; Expressions on Cancer from the Island of Ireland and the United States", which exhibited in Belfast, Dublin and the Rotunda, Washington DC.

Artist Statement

To work from life is to work before nature as a student with a great Master.

To stand in front of a mountain swirling with clouds is to see energy and movement in a constantly changing series of patterns.

To observe such a drama is also to observe light and lines, colour and shadows.

To feel these elements is to reflect upon our won human qualities.

What part of this ethereal scene is to be harvested? It's energy? It's beauty? It's emotion?

The camera may record a fraction of it, in the blink of an eye, but may miss the point.

Stand there again with humility and let the paint take over to reveal the real moment.

This is the state of revelation; of actuality, of spirit expressed in cool reds, warm blues and glorious shadows.

It is elusive, and challenging to create, but it's the essence of being - a moment of passion and connection,

Simply put - it's the experience of a mystery.




FEBRUARY 1st, COURT OF APPEALS, PASADENA

AL SETTON ACRYLICS WORKSHOP JANUARY 21 – 23, 2009

An Al Setton Workshop creates an opportunity for discovery. Content of this three day workshop will center around design/composition and expressive use of color. along the way, Al will identify and discuss ways to address common painting problems he has encountered in his years of teaching, attending shows, and judging exhibits. His artistic journey is self-directed beginning with training at California Art Institute. Since then he has selectively attended workshops and seminars of many prominent artists as well as doing extensive study and "eye training" by attending museums and art shows.

Al's large format paintings have energetic relationships of shapes and color harmonies. To help you get the most from this workshop, he suggests giving some thought ahead of time to what you would like to get out of it. Paint looser? Better design? Better color? How to add emotional content? None of the above? During the workshop, you will have opportunity for instruction tailored to your needs, especially if you know what you would like to achieve.

Al will be demonstrating in acrylics. However, you may use any medium you wish unless it is too smelly or too dusty that it may bother others. He creates a casual, friendly atmosphere and an easy, open dialogue with students, making his workshops a joyful experience. 


