

Both surfaces are made from synthetic polymers and were initially made for the advertising industry for sighs, bags, posters and banners. This substrate floats the paint on the surface ethic creates cute a challenge in control but fits my personality for its "happy accidents" and constant surprises of chance. It gives an advantage of being useful for imaginative compositions in either watercolor or acrylic

which rubbing alcohol, college, ink, pencil and caran d'ache crayons may be added for additional textures. While I love painting nature items, I have become addicted to rocks and canyons as subjects. Painting 3 days a week motivates me to paint more and inspires me to share my work in numerous area shows and area completions. Let the fun begin.



MICHI IKEDA

When I paint with watercolor I focus on colors and shapes by rearranging what I have in front of me. I studied with Tom Fong for years and have taken classes and gone on some trips with Chris Van Winkle. George Haft was 3 my beginning teacher.

PRE-REGISTRATION by MAIL

Registration begins January 28, 2019 through March 2, 2019 postmark deadline. Artwork received at take-in must be the same as on the registration form. Once the pre-registration form is submitted, artists cannot make any changes.

FEES:

SINGLE Entry Only* - \$25.00 for General Membership and Honor Court members. All eligibility rules apply. CCMA will assess a 35% fee on all art sales.

MEMBER TAKE-IN DATE: Saturday, March 16, 2019 - 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm.

Paintings arriving after the designated take-in time will not be accepted, and the entry fee will not be refunded. To Be Announced – in Newsletter and at General Meetings - Volunteer Transporters will be available to pick-up and take-in your artwork before the exhibit take-in date. You must make your own arrangements with the transporters.

PICK UP DAY: is Sunday May 19, 2019 - 12:00 pm to 3:00 pm, (NOT Saturday the 18th.)

Each member is responsible for picking-up or making arrangements for pick-up of their artwork. Neither Mid Valley Art League nor the exhibition venue will be responsible for the storage of the paintings. MVAL and CCMA do not keep your artwork transportation packaging.

ELIGIBILITY and PREPARATION - Found in Member's Directory

Mid-Valley Arts League members only. Original work, not over three years old. Use wire support with 'D' rings only. No saw-tooth hangers. Plexiglass cover only. Actual size of artwork is not to exceed 48" inches in any one direction. Stretched canvas paintings need not be framed. Paintings must be titled and identified with price or NFS, please see Registration Form.

HONOR COURT CRITERIA:

Entries submitted by members of the Honor Court will be juried separately and awarded prizes separately. Membership in the Honor Court is determined by the Selection Committee using criteria including: publication of the artist's work, best of show winners, signature membership in other art organizations, service as a juror in art exhibitions, workshop demonstrators and teaching experience.

GALLERY RULE:

CCMA has a gallery rule that if you have had a painting in a show at the CCMA Gallery, you may not enter it into another show at the gallery. It may only be displayed once. Keep this in mind as you choose your entries.

DEFINITION OF CATEGORIES - Found in Member's Directory

There are NO entry categories for Honor Court entries.

The categories for General Membership entries shall be as follows:

• **Abstract:** Paintings, which use a visual language of form, line, color, and texture to create a composition, which may be found in nature or other visual references. The art is more of a departure from reality and can be considered more interpretive or impressionistic.

And Non-Objective: Paintings which do not portray figures, objects or scenes from the natural world. The work is not particularly recognizable.

- Landscape: Paintings the main subject of which is an outdoor nature scene.
 - **And Seascape:** Paintings the main subject of which is an outdoor scene including the ocean.
- **Genre:** Paintings the main subject of which features and emphasizes people in scenes from everyday life. **And Animal:** Paintings the main subject of which is one or more animals
- **Portraits/Figure:** Paintings the main subject of which is human figures or heads.
- **Floral/Still Life:** Paintings the main subject of which are flowers and/or other inanimate objects such as food, dishes or fruit.
- **Structural-Mechanical:** Paintings the main subject of which is buildings, city scape and/or equipment.

The submitting artist shall choose the category in which a painting shall be entered, however, the Exhibit Chair may combine categories due to low number of entries.

Ride the wave, get the drift and settle for more by using granulating watercolors and saturated paper to portray your unique world view! Move beyond painting literal representations by learning to distill the essence of your preferred subject matter. Create art with a bold, experimental attitude by learning to capitalize on the synergy of quality watercolor paper and sedimentary pigments influenced by graity. Employ spatial divisions, value organization, color harmonies and your own unique artist's marks to produce fresh and powerful statements that will draw viewers across the room. Discover your personal abstract predilections and inspiration and learn about the use of symbols for emotional impact. Risë's demonstrations will share techniques for recovering light shapes while freely painting medium and dark values with gorgeous textures. Previous experience with watercolor is necessary.
